Voters in Oakland County and across
Michigan will go to the polls Tuesday,
Aug. 7, to nominate candidates in Dem-
ocratic and Republican primaries for
parish offices.

These include U.S. senator, U.S. rep-
resentative, state representative, Oak-
land County administrators, Oakland
County commissioners and township
offices.

Winners of primaries will square off
in the Nov. 6 election, when they will
be joined by "minor party" candidates.
(Minor parties pick their candidates at
conventions.)

VOTERS ALSO will nominate candi-
dates for nonpartisan district judge in
districts where more than two persons
filed for a single post.

And they will decide whether to re-
new for another five years an Oakland
County parks and recreation property
tax of a quarter-mill (25 cents per
\$1,000 of state equalized valuation.)

Despite ~~split cases~~ ^{split cases} over redistrict-
ing, voters will find themselves in the
same state House of Representatives
districts as in 1982. If you have a ques-
tion about which congressional, legisla-
tive or county commissioner districts
you live in, contact your local city or
township clerk.

Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8
p.m. You need not declare your party
affiliation, and you may vote in either
party's primary — but not in both. If
you attempt to vote in both parties' pri-
maries, your ballot can be invalidated.

Leagues of Women Voters in Oakland

County and the League of Women vot-
ers of Michigan have prepared this
guide.

secured by letter. Answers are in the
candidates' own words and have not
been edited except for length, spelling
and punctuation.

An ellipsis (. . .) is used to indicate a

candidate's reply exceeded the stated
word limit. Candidates who did not re-
spond to our questionnaire have "No
reply received" after their names. Can-
didates whose response did not arrive
prior to our deadline have "Reply not
received in time for publication" after
their names.

All certified candidates for these of-
