Calming the council "has become polarized," Marks says controversy over, for example, the recent planning commission appointments, "all stem from coalitions or power blocks."

That's why the charter commission specifically chose to have a weak may or form of government. The absence of wards also points to the charter commission's desire to avoid partisan politics, Marks said.

"I think the city council has not beed one of our better city councils," Marks said. "I think they have done a good job and a bad job."

The bad job refers directly to coun-cil's tendency to shy-away from raising taxes when needed, he said.
