HUNTER'S SAFETY CLINIC — In accordance with Michigan state law, participation in a certified hunter's safety clinic is required by all youth 12-16 years of age wishing to purchase their first hunting license. This six-hour

course is designed to teach the individual all aspects of hunter's safety, and, after successful completion of the course, the individual will receive a Hunter Safety Certificate. Class will be held 6-9 p.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 19, and Tuesday, Sept. 26, at the Farmington Hills Library, 33737 W. 12 Mile. A pre-registration fee of \$3 is required and may be submitted to the parks and recreation office.

FITNASTICS — Enjoy toning your

body to a formulated routine of exercises and dance. The twice-a-week sessions will meet on Monday and Wednesday, beginning 6:30-7:30 p.m. Monday, Sept. 17, at the Picomonte Club, 38515 W. Nine Mile, Farmington Hills. The fee for this nine-week session is \$35 and you may preregister at the parks and recreation office.

COMMUNITY CHORUS — The Farmington Hills Community Chorus will begin this fall season with rehearsals

als beginning 7:30-9:30 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 11. All adults and high school students who enjoy music are welcome to attend. The 12-week session will coincide with a holiday concert for the community. The site of the rehearsals is North Farmington High School. The registration fee is \$20 per participant, which includes music. You may register at the parks and recreation office or at the first rehearsal. Auditions will be held at the first rehearsal.

THERAPEUTIC BOWLING

LEAGUE — The league is designed for any adult to moderately mentally or physically impaired person, age 7 and up. Participants will be placed on teams with respect to age and disability. The activity begins Friday, Sept. 21, and continues at Ark West Lanes in Southfield through Dec. 7. The fee for this session is \$14 and includes bowling shoes, three games of bowling and team patch. The group will meet 4:50-5:30 p.m. and you may preregister at our office.

CANOE AND KAYAK TOURING CLINIC — The Farmington Hills Parks and Recreation Department in cooperation with the America Youth Hostels, will provide a demonstration and display of different types of canoes and touring kayaks on Saturday, Sept. 8, at Kent Lake Beach, Island Lake Recreation Area from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The clinic will also include paddling techniques, safety instructions, trip planning, gear packing and deep water rescue techniques.

Funds available for education

Veterans serving between August 1964 and May 1975 who did not use up their original education benefits have another chance to attend college.

Under the Delimiting Date Extension Program, the federal government has allocated \$20 million nationwide for qualifying veterans who are unemployed, hold low-paying jobs, or lack training. Funds will be awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis.

The program is designed to provide marketable skills to individuals who

wish to earn an Associate's degree in a vocational area. While 50 percent of the selected course work must be in

approved vocational programs, the remaining half may include general education classes which provide skills in areas such as English and math development.

Loan money for Delimiting Date Ex-

tension students who choose Applied Technology programs will be available.

Veterans interested in taking advantage of the Delimiting Date Extension Program must first contact the Regional Veterans Administration Office (1-800-82-0740) to determine if they qualify.

Initially, tuition and other expenses are paid by eligible participants. Benefit payments are then provided by the V.A.

Veterans who wish to enroll for the fall semester in any of over 80 vocational programs at Oakland Community College should contact Auburn Hills Campus counselor Randy Sion for details. He can be reached at 553-4261 or 553-4262.
