

Trio of seniors to guide Mercy

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• Amy DeMatia. Rugged, clutch two-year starter. Her 330 career rebounds are eighth best in Mercy history. She grabbed 123 last year. She, too, was all-area and all-state last year. She has the knack of playing her best in the crucial games. Grade point — 4.0.

• Terri Ford. Started as a sophomore last year and was one of the team's leaders in points and rebounds. Perhaps the best pure athlete on a squad of outstanding athletes. Won numerous honorable mention accolades

last year. "Before she graduates, she should help rewrite our record book," Baker said. Especially the offensive record book.

• Sue Scott. Was a key role player on last year's squad. Explosive performer, combining speed and strength. She dazzled the opposition during camp this summer and earned herself a starting spot at guard. Outstanding defensive player with improving offensive skills.
