State Superintendent of Public Instruc-tion Phillip E. Runkel said testimony at

the hearings will be summarized and pre-sented to the State Board before it takes action on the proposed rule changes. Revisions have been proposed by the Certification Code. Study Commission named by the state Board of Education last year to make recommendations on a broad range of issues concerning teacher preparation and certification. The proposed changes would:

• Establish a third level of certifica-tion, which would be required of teachers providing instruction at the middle grade

The elementary level certificate would be valid for grades K-4, the middle level certificate would be valid for grades 5-5, and the high school level certificate would be valid for grades 1-12.

Require that all teachers seeking certification be required to take a three-hour course in the education of exceptional children.
