
be at the Beech Woods Arena and the fee is \$25.

When one-half inch is used for cable-casting is the correct speed and special attention to lighting is essential as these characteristics are first to cause deficiencies. Therefore, a producer must think ahead as to the medium for which the show is intended. Remember, use of community-access equipment is to provide cable-television shows for community ocasumption only. If a producer would like copies of the show, this may be achieved only after the production has been scheduled for viewing on Channel 12.
