College hosts open house

At the close of National Higher Education Week, Center for Creative Studies-College of Art and Design will open its doors to the public from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 21, with visual arts demonstrations, exhibits, and related lectures.

Guests are invited to tour the campus and observe demonstrations in airbrushing, calligraphy, ceramics, fiber design, glassblowing, metals and jewelry, painting, printmaking and sculpture.

They can also visit the student exhibits including craft, fine art, graphic communication, industrial design and photography works.

Faculty members, admissions staff, students and alumni will answer questions about the college, its programs, admission requirements and careers in the visual arts.

"People from all walks of life attend our annual open house," says Arthur Greenblatt, academic dean. "Some hope to become students, others are working artists, and many are simply friends of the college and patrons of the arts."

Astronomer to lecture

Gordon MacAlpine, professor of astronomy, University of Michigan, will talk at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday in Room 294, J Building, Orchard Ridge Campus, Oakland Community College, on "Cosmology With Quasars." Guests are invited at no charge.

MacAlpine, described as "a brilliant astronomer and exciting speaker," will omit some of the abstract and mathematical aspects of his topic for the novice in his audience here.

Quasars are believed by some astronomers to be the most energetic and distant observable objects in the universe. Their physical conditions are unlike any found or producible on Earth, and these beacons of light provide the only probes for much of the vastness of spacetime.

Of his lecture he says, "We shall examine the controversial nature of quasars and speculate about their role in the grand scheme of cosmology. Newly discovered quasar samples enable us to explore the farthest reaches of our universe. It appears we have finally detected the edge. But where? And why?"

MacAlpine's talk is sponsored by Detroit Metropolitan Area Physics Teachers in conjunction with the college.

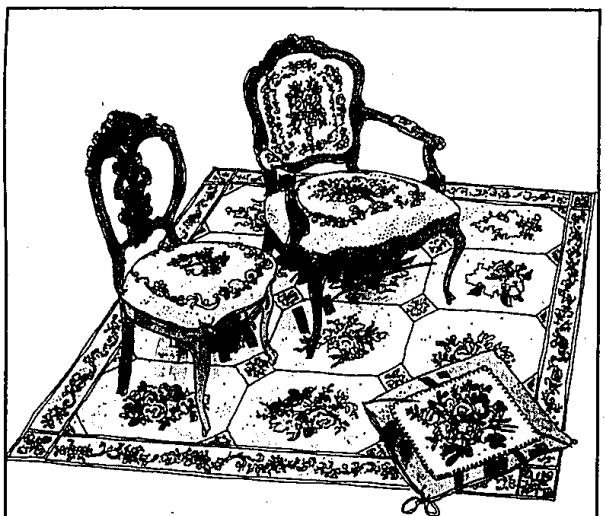
