SECRETARY OF STATE Richard Austin today reminded all individuals that Tuesday is the last day to register to vote in the November presidential election. Austin reminded those not yet registered that they may do so in Secretary of State branch offices or the office of city or township clerks or their deputy registrars.

SCOTT SMITH, Daniel Selke and Albert LaForet have been named in the 1984 edition of Outstanding Young Men of America. They were selected from nominations received from senators, congressmen, governors, mayors, state legislators, university or college presidents or deans as well as various civic groups, including the United States Jaycees which also endorses the Outstanding Young Men of America program. The criteria for selection include a man's voluntary service to community, professional leadership, academic achievement, business advancement, cultural accomplishments and civic and political participation.

MICHAEL E. PANETTA, son of Joseph and Elizabeth Panetta of Farmington, has been officially accepted into the U.S. Military Academy's Corps of Cadets as a new member of the class of 1988 during the annual acceptance parade. The parade followed six weeks of rigorous basic cadet training at the West Point, N.Y., academy. The academy is a four-year educational institution graduating men and women to serve as career Army officers. In addition to military training, the academy offers athletics and an academic curriculum which includes basic and engineering sciences and social sciences and the humanities.

DONNA LEWIS, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Glenn Lewis of Farmington Hills, will play Noah's wife in the Albion College production of "Noah and the Flood." This is her first production appearance at Albion.
