Krejci has been at the University of Lancaster since 1969 where his positions have included serving as senior lecturer in the Department of Religious, French, and German Studies. He has authored numerous publications including, "What is a Nation, The Dilemma of Historical Experience in Religion and Politics in the Modern World," published by New York University Press in 1983.

local cable firm. With the proposed legislation, offenders could be prosecuted under federal law.

While generally happy with the proposed legislation, McCann said he is disappointed that the "access to provision" was deleted.

That provision would have allowed cable firms to have access to apartment buildings and complexes so they could provide renters with cable service.

Currently, cable firms have to reach an agreement with the owners of apartments and other rental units before cable service can be provided to tenants.

According to the tri-city franchise agreement, apartment complex owners have the option of charging MetroVision an access fee. The fee is a charge above the cost of installing cable in their units.

In turn, MetroVision has the option of passing the fee on to the subscribers.

The access fee is determined by the complex owner.

Krejci, who is on the faculty of the University of Lancaster (England), studied law at Charles University of Prague from 1953 to 1959 when his education was disrupted by the Nazi shut down of Czech institutions of higher education. He attained his doctorate in 1945 and in 1946 received a medal for participation in the anti-Nazi resistance movement.

Imprisoned in 1954 for allegedly trying to turn Czechoslovakia back into a capitalist state, Krejci says his six-year imprisonment was for "elaborating and defending a social democratic approach to economic planning before the Communist takeover in 1948 and for helping to promote independent 'objectivist' research in an economic insti-

is rolled back as a result of Proposal C, the city would continue to have this debt obligation," Deadman said.

WHILE INTERPRETATIONS differ as to what tax rate a city may have to roll back or up to, there is little difference of opinion about Proposal C's impact on city charter tax limits.

Both Davis and Headlee, as well as officials in Farmington and Farmington Hills recognize that if Proposal C passes, charter limits would be nullified.

"Further impact of Proposal C is that council would no longer have the flexibility of operating within the city's 20 mill charter," Deadman said.

Farmington Hills officials also expect the proposed amendment would require the city to roll back its current 10-mill charter limit.

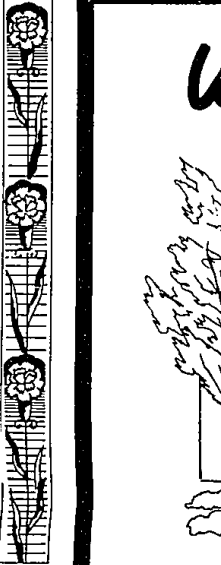
Headlee says a city's charter limit is "not in stone." If a city finds it needs more taxes for operations or debt, officials simply must go to the voters with a request for additional taxes and for what purpose the money would be used.
