OCC growth spurs changes

New provists have been named to two of Oakland Community College's four campuses — Auburn Hills and Orchard Ridge — and a change in a vice presidency.

The promotions give Auburn Hills its second female provost. Known for its "high tech" offerings, the Auburn Helghts campus is the only one ever led by a woman.

Auburn Hills will be headed by Christine Gram of Farmington Hills. She was previously academic dean of the Highland Lakes campus, Union Lake.
Gram replaces Marion Rice, now chancellor of Florida Institute of Technology's Jensen Beach campus. Rice became OCC's first female provost in September 1974.

Thompson. Tender resident replaces Richard T. Thompson.
Thompson of Millord was promoted to the newly re-established position of vice president of student and academic affairs.
The changes had been contemplated for months by OCC President Robert F. Roelofs. He noted that many administrators had been in their jobs five years or more. He saw the Stevenson-Thompson change as broadening the experiences of both men, although they had been performing well in their previous posts.
