He was featured on CBS News' "60 Minutes" in 1976 as one of the youngest elected public officials in the U.S. He was founder and first president of Parents-Teachers Prevention group in Council Bluffs, Iowa, a former Youth

Involvement Co-ordinator for PRIDE and is author of "Marijuana - The Verdict if Yours."

CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order at 8:00 p.m. on October 1, 1984, by Mayor Pro-Tem Hartsock in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.

PRESENT: Bennett, Hartsock, Tupper, Walker.
ABSENT: Mayor Yoder.

OTHERS PRESENT: City Manager Deadman, Director Billing, Director Lauboff, City Treasurer Cantrell, City Attorney Kelly, Thomas Doecher and Gordon Kratzer, Plante & Moran, City Clerk Bushey.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved.
Plante & Moran presented their Annual Report of the City's financial statements for the year ended June 30, 1984.

Minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.
Council granted a sign variance for a banner to be erected between the Village Mall and the Arts Above on Grand River from October 13 through October 20, 1984.

Council granted permission to Farmington Senior High School for their Annual Falcon Winter Run scheduled for December 1, 1984.

Council supported the following resolutions:
From the City of Birmingham supporting House and Senate Bills granting local government immunity from antitrust laws.

From the City of Oak Park supporting legislation providing for reasonable control of cable television services and rates by local government.

Council proclaimed October 15, 1984, as **CHARITABLE PROPERTY AND CASUALTY UNDERWRITERS (CPCU) DAY**.

Council accepted the bid of Sullivan-Widmer in the amount of \$1,240.00 and Pine Lumber Cashway's quotation of \$773.00 for materials for replacement of the Historical Museum Carriage House roof.

Council approved the issuance of an additional bond plate to the ABC Cab Company. Council granted a parade permit to the Knights Templar during their state convention to be held in the Farmington area in June of 1987.

Council received the City Manager's analysis of the impact of Proposal "C" on city revenues.

Council tabled an appointment to the Economic Development Corporation until the next regular meeting.

Council postponed their previously scheduled work session of October 10 until October 15, 1984 at 6:30 p.m. A second work session was set for 6:30 p.m. on November 5, 1984.

Council approved the deferrals recommended by the Review Committee for Special Assessment Deferred Payments.

Monthly bills were approved for payment.
Meeting adjourned at 9:17 p.m.

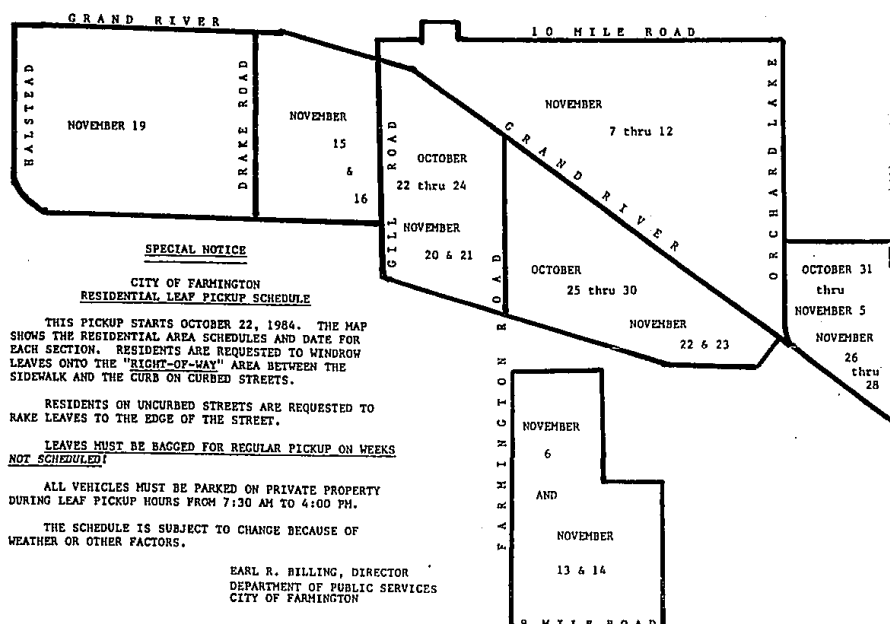
