A college that's free

You can serve your country on active duty with the armed forces and attend medical school at the same time if you qualify for admission to the nation's only military medical school.

Called the F. Edward Hebert School of Medicine of the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS), it is operated by the Department of Defense in Bethesda, Md., to train physicians for the Army, Navy and Air Force.

The tuition-free school exists because the armed forces need physicians to take care of active and retired service members and their families.

Applicants to the program must have attained a baccalaureate degree as of June 30 of the year of planned matriculation, and should have solid background in science and mathematics. Applicants must take the new Medical College Application test, and apply to USUHS through the American Medical College Application Service (AMCAS).

Human chain calls for nuclear freeze

Three Farmington-based groups are listed as sponsors of The Survival Line, the human chain that will link the hands of 10,000 persons Saturday, Oct. 20, in a demonstration calling for a nuclear freeze.

chain from Farmington Chapter of OWL (Older Women's League), Sisters of Mercy, Province of Detroit; and Women's Center, Orchard Ridge Campus, Oakland Community College.

The human chain will connect the Light Guard Army on Detroit's east side with the Artillery Army on the west side in Oak Park at noon for eight minutes as a display of unity for peace. Eight minutes is significant because it is that amount of time that it would take for the first nuclear weapons to reach the United States or the Soviet Union.

Organizing The Survival Line has been coordinated through the Detroit Area Nuclear Weapons Freeze with about 75 other peace, religious, justice and community organizations pledging to bring their own contingents to the line.

The chain is expected to be six and one half miles in link, and will be formed rain or shine.

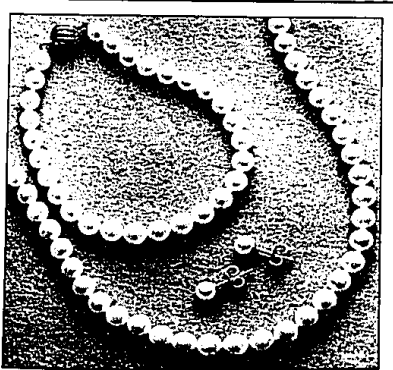
