

Rescind liquor license — mayor

Ernie's.
"I think it is above board and the proper way to do it," said Councilman Donn Wall, reminding Williams of the possible conflict as well as his initial decision to abstain.
Ernie's lost its bid in council's 4-1 vote.

DUDLEY RESPONDED with a motion to reserve the license for one year for Etkin Equities.

"I think this offers the best solution for the city and the applicant," Dudley said.

Some thought otherwise. Councilwoman Jan Dolan said she felt the license should be issued to Ernie's because the restaurant is a local business and has been a part of the community for several years.
Dolan and Anzlovic also indicated that Etkin Equities seems financially able to purchase a license.
Again council stated when they

voted 4-1 on reserving the license for Etkin. Dolan voted against the development firm.
In its initial deliberations, council did not move on approving the license for either Capraro's or Kasbat because both had applied for a resort license.
Both applications were tied up in red tape because the LCC will not issue a resort license when a city still has a license to issue, said City Manager William Costick.

"Everyone was stymied without the issuance of it," Costick said, referring to the remaining license.
Capraro's and Kasbat urged council to make a decision Tuesday so they could make progress in their attempts to get a resort license.

Calling the statement "our Mexican stand-off," Soronen said council would have to either consider Capraro's or vote again on Etkin or Ernie's if Dolan or Dudley would change their vote.
"It's all due respect to Mrs. Dolan and Ernie's, so I will not change my mind," Dudley said.

BREAKING NEWS TO A CHILD

It is important that a youngster be informed IMMEDIATELY of the death of a loved one. If possible, he should be told by a parent or someone close to him, in a familiar setting such as the home. A delay in informing the child only increases the likelihood that he will learn of the death under less than ideal circumstances.
The need to break the sad news expeditiously does not mean that it should be done with any less gentleness or sensitivity. One experienced professional suggests that the adult begin with a discussion of nature, of the flowering and fruiting of plants, of their fading away in the fall and winter. Emphasis should be on the beauty of life rather than on the mortality of death.
Even honest explanations should be free of terrible details. A child can identify too closely with a story of accident or illness and may begin to fear for his own life.
