Wartime flier recalls fallen 'Lady'

No one thought so during the last days of 1944 when he and his Army Air Corps crew crash landed their grieviously wounded B-17 Fying Fortress in France — and lived to tell about it — tank he doesn't want anyone thinking so now.

"We were some of many thousands who were on those flights," said Purdy, then a 21-year-old Air Corps captain and first pilot of "Lucky Lady," a B-17


