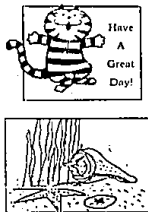
Botsford's new unit opens for visitors

Insight, Botsford Hospital's new chemical dependency unit, will open its doors for visitors from 3-7 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 23. Insight is located in Botsford's Education and Administration Center, adjacent to the main facility on Grand River west of Eight Mile Road.

The open house will offer area residents and professionals an opportunity to meet the staff and discuss treatment offered.

Insight has been admitting persons with alcohol and drug problems since Oct. 1. During a stay of between 3-5 days patients undergo an intensive medical and therapeutic program with careful monitoring of the withdrawal stages, education on the disease and motivation to continue treatment beyond hospitalization.

The unit is administered jointly by the hospital and Insight, a Flint-based treatment agency with similar acute care programs at hospitals in Flint, Saginaw and Lansing.
