'What's at Stake' is topic for lecture

"What's at Stake in the Election of 1984" is the lecture topic for Howard Simon, who will speak at 8 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 30 in Jewish Community Center, 6600 Maple, West Bloomfield.

Simon, who is executive director of American Civil Liberties Union of Michigan (ACLU), will address the issues of prayer in the public schools, maintaining civil liberties and challenges to individual freedom. He will examine the positions of both

candidates for the office of U.S. President and evaluate how American lives would be affected by both possible administrations. Simon has served as executive director for ACLU in Michigan for the past 10 years. He has a doctorate from University of Minnesota in legal and political philosophy and social ethics.
