She will perform works by Beethoven, Schumann, Chopin and Ravel.

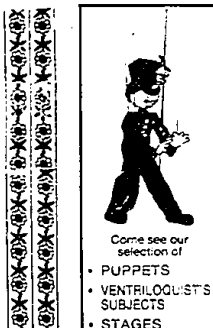
