

# Voters to elect one state rep. and 3 county commissioners

Farmington and Farmington Hills voters will have one state representative to elect and three county commissioner races to consider in next week's November elections.

If re-elected on Nov. 6, Wilbur "Sandy" Brotherton will be serving his sixth term in the state legislature as the 69th district representative.

The Republican lawmaker is being challenged by 30-year-old Democrat Vicki Barnett, president of CC Visuals, a greeting card manufacturer. She also is the co-chair for the Farmington Democratic Club.

The 62-year-old Brotherton has served five terms in the state house. Before going to Lansing, he served a term as county commissioner. Before that he served 14 years on the Farmington City Council, seven as that city's mayor.

Both Brotherton and Barnett have spoken out against Proposal C, "Voter's

Choice," indicating that its implementation would damage the effectiveness of needed services.

Barnett has called for diversification of Michigan's industrial base by encouraging non-automotive durable goods producers to locate in Michigan. She also would like to see funds used to have unemployed workers do road and bridge repairs.

Barnett has taken a hard line on education, saying that she would like to see high school graduation requirements strengthened statewide as well as adult education program aimed at job retraining.

On the economic front, Brotherton believes that the 38 percent income tax increase was "too much for too long. He also has been critical of the Blanchard administration for not including more funds in the state budget for educational aid.

**IN THE COUNTY** Commission race,

two incumbents are nearly assured of being re-elected.

Republican incumbent John McDonald, a 44-year-old attorney is being challenged by Elizabeth Mihelich, a teacher and free lance writer in the 27th district.

Because the district is so highly populated by Republicans, McDonald is the favorite to win.

In the 21st Commission district, veteran commissioner Alex Perinoff is being challenged by Republican Lew Barnett. Although a small part of the district includes southeast Farmington Hills, the majority is in Southfield, a

traditionally Democratic area.

Perinoff has been a county commissioner for 20 years as well as a practicing attorney. Barnett is a mechanical engineering consultant. He has been an Oakland County resident for 30 years.

In the 15th district, Republican David Moffitt, 31, is seeking to replace his mother, Lillian, who chose to step down from the county seat. Moffitt is being challenged by Kenneth Wittenberg, a 19-year Democrat from Bloomfield Hills.

Wittenberg is a student at the University of Michigan. Moffitt is a lawyer.

## Area student sits on court

Lynda Knoll of Farmington Hills was named to Michigan State University's 1984 homecoming court.

Knoll was selected from among 30 applicants representing either a registered student organization, an individual college, or a living unit on campus.

The five-male, five-female court was chosen on the basis of academic record,

achievements, leadership, diversity and poise.

Court members were recognized during halftime activities at the MSU-Indiana football game Oct. 13, in Spartan Stadium. The game culminated a week of homecoming activities, including a pep rally and bonfire, a circus and a fireworks display.
