## Hills executive teaches at Madonna College

Two professors new to Madonna College this fall will be sharing with their students many years of business experience as well as superior academic qualifications.

Graduate students, earning degrees in business administration, as well as undergraduate students, will learn the marketing and promotion techniques which earned Dr. Ralph Harris executive positions with General Motors, Reynolds Aluminum, Kenyon and Eckhardt and Chrysler Corp. over a 17-year work history.

One of the most important things students will learn from him, however, according to Harris, is creativity.

"What's in the course is not as important as the thinking process that can develop," said Harris, a Farmington Hills resident. "My greatest thrill is to watch the students' eyes light up once

their aspiration levels are raised and they realize their analytical capabilities," he said.

While at Chrysler, Harris created and implemented a musical safety show which became a vital part of the driver's education program in high schools across the United States.

Dr. Leon Levitt, recently a professor of business administration and education at Loyola Marymount University, Los Angeles, will bring a humanities component to the graduate course, Ethical Considerations in Administration, as well as undergraduate courses, Business Law and Principles of Management.

"I look upon teaching as a vocation," Levitt said. "I feel it is my obligation to be an accessible instructor so that my students can come to me with any questions they might have," he added.
