## Police investigate auto death

Police plan to seek a charge of negligent homicide against an unidentified 40-year-old Farmington Hills man who was involved in a head-on car accident Nov. 9 in which a Mercy High School student was killed.

Elizabeth L. Scharret, 17, died of multiple injuries at Botsford General Hospital at about 1:30 p.m. Nov. 10, according to Russ Tuttle, hospital public relations director.

The Birmingham resident was the daughter of James Scharret, Southfield director of management and budget, and his wife Carolyn.

According to Lt. Ernest Miller of the Farmington Hills Police Department, the 40-year-old man crossed the center line on Middlebelt, near Hemlock, and struck Scharret's head-on. Scharret was traveling north along Middlebelt. The accident occurred at about 7:30 p.m. Nov. 9, Miller said.

Farmington Hills police plan to seek a warrant from a prosecutor's office against the driver on a charge of negligent homicide some time this week, Miller said last Friday.

Anta Bissone, 22, of Lapeer, the driver of a third car which struck the rear of Scharret's car was also taken to

Botsford, according to Miller. Botsford officials had no record of Bissone's admission into the hospital.

Funeral services for Scharret were last Wednesday in Unity Church of God, Warren. Burial was Glen Eden Cemetery, Farmington.

Scharret grew up in Oak Park and attended Ferndale public schools for nine years. She attended Mercy High School in her freshman year. When the family moved to Birmingham, she enrolled in Seaholm High School.

Scharret received a varsity letter in gymnastics at Seaholm and was active in a number of sports. She returned to

Mercy High School during her junior and senior years and took classes at Oakland Community College for prehigh-school graduation credits.

Scharret loved skiing, gymnastics, swimming and horseback riding. She played the flute and took lessons in ballet and jazz dancing.

## Woman seeks liver for transplant

Encouragement and support are being offered a Livonia woman awaiting a life-saving liver transplant.

The woman's sister, Suzanne Portman, vows to raise funds needed for

Glynda Chamie's transplant operation. About a dozen notes of encouragement and offers to assist in fund raising, coupled with cash contributions, arrived at the Portman household following a news story about the fund drive.

"It's not a lot but it's a start," Portman said. "They're all such nice people. It's a start."

As of last week, contributions totaled \$332, about one-third of which was contributed by the employees of a Romulus trucking company where Portman's husband, Don, works. Individual contributions ranged from \$2 to \$50.

One woman wrote, "Keep up your brave and wonderful attitude and you will win with God's help."

One letter was from a woman Chamie helped many years ago when the woman fell and injured herself. Portman said. The writer reminded Chamie that she took her to a clinic and walked and waited with me. And you didn't even have lunch."

PORTMAN said she has received pledges of help from the Livonia Lamplighter Lions Club, Chrysler Co. employees, and the Straight Harmony Sweet Adeline singers, who have offered to perform at a benefit.

Portman is planning to launch a city-wide benefit in the near future. Those interested in contributing can

send checks, made out to "A Liver for Glynda," and addressed to Suzanne Portman, 15436 Comstock, Livonia 48154. An account has been made out in that name at a local bank.

Chamie's liver ailment, a condition called primary sclerosing cholangitis,

resulted after a serious car accident more than two years ago. She has been in and out of hospitals ever since, and is being cared for in her sister's Livonia home. Portman says the liver transplant is expected to cost between \$150,000 and \$250,000.

**VETERAN BURIAL ALLOWANCES**

The government will pay a lump sum toward burial expenses for veterans eligible for VA pensions or compensation and those who die in VA medical facilities. This also applied to peacetime veterans who die of service-connected disabilities, or who were receiving a pension or compensation. The cost of transporting the remains to the place of burial may be paid by the government if the death occurred while the veteran was hospitalized under VA care.

A further sum is payable to the next of kin as a plot or interment allowance when the veteran is not buried in a national cemetery. A considerably higher sum is paid if the veteran dies of a service-connected disability.

The Social Security Administration will make an additional lump-sum payment toward funeral and burial costs to surviving spouses for veterans with Social Security credits.

We will be more than willing to help coordinate if assistance is needed.
