Pine Mountain is one of 15 state resort parks in Kentucky, all of them offering various combina-tions of lodge, cabins, campgrounds, hiking trails and nearby attractions. Most of them have lodges and certages open all year, so you can "go to the ortlage" at any time of year and you never need to repair the roof. Pine Mountain was the first Kentucky state park, its 2,500 acres of Inevised mountainside donated by for efforts of Pineville, the historic town at the foot of the mountain.
