Promotion for area resident

A plumber soldering too close to sub-flooring ignited a fire last Wednesday afternoon causing approximately \$40,000 to an unfinished Covington Club townhouse in Farmington Hills, according to fire officials.

"You couldn't see any flames. But there was a lot of smoke coming out of

the second story," said Fire Chief Richard Marinucci.

Blaze damages new condos

The townhouse is one of 80 units lo-cated in a new complex at Middlebelt and 14 Mile.

Although fire officials estimated the amount of damage at \$75,000, a spokesman for Kaftan Enterprises Inc., developers of the complex, estimated damage at \$40,000.

CALLING THE fire accidental, Marinucci said the plumber was "putting in pipes. He was soldering a connection with a torch." The fire "spread up a pipe chase and then spread up be tween the second-story floor and firstfloor celling," Marinucci said.

Although most of the fire damage was in the second-story floor, first-sto-ry celling, and drywall, fire fighters

were forced to "poke holes in the walls because of the fire in them. It started to spread up (through the walls)," Mar-inucel said.

"It was hot and smoking (inside the townhouse) but we couldn't see what was burning," he added.

Twenty-one fire fighters extinguished the fire in about 25 minutes, Marinucci said.




