## Most area reps like seat belt bill

State Rep. William Keith, D-Garden City, broke ranks with most suburban lawmakers as the Michigan House of Representatives defeated a bill to require motorists to wear automobile seat belts. Nine other area lawmakers supported the bill, which sponsor David Hollister, D-Lansing, admitted is "done for now."

"My phone's been ringing off the book 2.1 in favor of the way! toveld," said Keith, a 42-year veteran of the House. "My constituents just didn't want the state forcing them to wear it. They just resent government coming into their cars and telling them what to do.

"My wife's with the Michigan Dental Association, and they're very much for it. If anyone's been beating me over the head with it, it's her," he laughed. Keith added the bill violated an ancient political principle: that laws should protect a person from society but not attempt to protect an individual from himself.

THE HOUSE voted 52-49 in favor of mandating seat belts, four short of the 56 needed for passage. Hollister said be would reintroduce the bill in the new session of the Legislature in 1985. "The issue will not go away," he said.
The bill split both parties. Democrats lined up 27-28 against it. Republicans were 25-21 in favor.
