The directors of cable television productions must have their wits about them. Their sole responsibility is to delegate responsibilities. The director determines the production atmosphere by the way he/she handles coordinating multiple functions at one time.

The first several minutes of a production will set the tone throughout. Therefore, practice saying commands out loud to become comfortable with asserting yourself. The following is a dialogue to practice at home.

Initiate appropriate camera shots and have camera technicians practice lining them up.

Roll tape: 1. Ready to bring in 'video,' 'audio,' 'Ready to cue talent.' 2. Bring in video audio. Cue talent. 3. Ready to take Camera 2. Take Camera 2. Ready to take Camera 1. Take Camera 1. Ready to take Camera 3. Take camera 3. etc.

Concise crisp directions will make for a successful production. Good luck.

If you really want to practice the role, slip on headphones and pull out your favorite deck chair and direct.

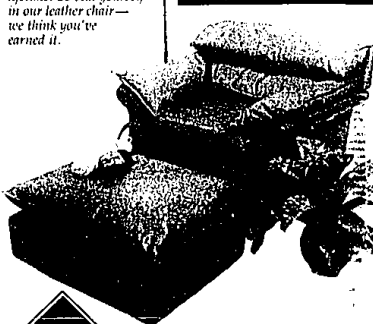
