## Tasters rate 10 cabernets

The quality of the vintage each year in California is measured by the response of the california sarvignose of course, but the cabernet is the key to the harvest, and the quality of wine each season is the benchmark against which a vintage is measured. Few can remember what kind of a year 1975 was for napa gamay or chenin blanc, but it is readily known as a mediocre year for cabernet.

And there is a great deal of variation, year to year, for cabernet. The 1974 was known for its degance and holding power, 1977 as a light year in spite of the drought, and 1980 for the power and intensity of the wines. The 1981 wintage, now that enough time has elapsed to permit perspective to develop along with the wines, can be evaluated as a fair year, lacking the grace of 1978 but exceeding that of 1979. Not known as 'keepers,' most 1981s are now available. These are being purchased with an eye to immediate consumption for many, storage the role for others.

A group of tasters recently gathered to evaluate 10 of the most publicited, awarded and promising of the perhaps 50-60 now on local shelves. It is always difficult to select those wines to be

used in a tasting, but one must make a set of choices and live with it. Using a nine-point scale, the follow-ing results came about. Each listing in-cludes the wine preceded by its rank-ing, then its mean score, and approxi-mate price:

1) David Bruce, 6.30, \$14 2) Newton, 6.11, \$14 3) Laurel (Gine, 5.93, \$15 4) Vichon, 5.70, \$14 5) Flora Springs, 5.6, \$15 6) Girard, 5.44, \$16 7) Buena Vista, 5.37, \$11 8) Alexander Valley, 4.96, \$10 9) Sequoid Grove, 4.67, \$14 10) William Wheeler, 4.44, \$10

ALL IN ALL, a rather imposing group, lis strong performance suggests that the 1881 vintage, with few exceptions, is now quite ready for drinking. As a group they are full of truit, moderate in tannins and show excellent acidity, No hurry about drinking any of these, however. This is the time to ac-

quire them.

There is little to choose between the David Bruce and the Newton. Both are fruity, highly approachable wines of sound character. The former has a bit more balance, the latter an earthness and intensity. The Laurel Glen, new in the state, is a huge and intense wine that should not be drunk for years. Full and round, its tannian will carry it long enough for it to develop into something quite decent.

The Vichon and Flora Springs, both most prestigious Napa properties, are more clegant than full, the former being expectally classy.

All in all, a vintage to esteem it not cherish, the 1981 cabernets reported here are not wholly dissimilar to others and suggest the vintage is safe for present consumption and limited storage.
