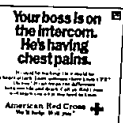
An orientation meeting begins at 10 a.m. Tuesday, Jan. 8, in Women's Resource Center.

## OC Health Division tests fake Cabbage Patch dolls

The fake Cabbage Patch Dolls that have been suspect because of a kerosene odor about them have been extensively tested by Michigan Department of Public Health. No evidence of pesticides or other contaminants has been found.

The health lab tested a half-dozen dolls that were confiscated by the FBI in the Detroit area. They were tested for traces of various volatile organic chemicals, pesticides and other toxic materials, and all tests have been negative.
