Among the courses being offered in winter term are "Congress: The People," an inside view of Congress; "Health Care Organization," an analysis of how the health care industry affects our daily lives; "The New Literacy," an overview of the computer and what it can and cannot do; "Sociology of the Auto Industry"; and the popular "Vietnam: A Television History."

Credit is available at 10 colleges and universities including: Cleary College (Ypsilanti); Eastern Michigan University; Madonna College; Michigan State University/Birmingham extension; Schoolcraft College; University of Michigan/Dearborn; University of Windsor; Washtenaw Community Col-

lege; Wayne County Community College; and Wayne State University.

Winter term traditionally has the largest enrollment for this unique service. This year, enrollment is expected to match last year when more than 1,700 students received college credit for telecourses viewed in their homes.
