## Music class stimulates youngster's creativity.

The unique philosophy of musical development in children based on the work of composer Carl Orff is now an integral part of Farmington Community Center's youth program. The method, called Orff-Schulwerk, frees the child's creativity and guides the child in becoming musically expressive and knowledgeable. Children become more musically aware and capable as they express themselves in chant, song, movement, and with especially designed instruments. Musical development which is based on the natural activities of children's speech, singing, and movement enhances and strengthens self-image. Each child becomes aware of his or her own special talents.

The classes are open to all children ages 3-7. Placement is based on age and experience. Two classes are presently offered by the center at 3:30 p.m. Tuesdays for ages 3-4 and at 4:30 p.m. for Tuesdays ages 5-7. The class runs eight weeks starting Jan. 22 and costs \$40.

Instructor Diane Raymond represents the Detroit Community Music School which services more than 1,800 students throughout the metropolitan area. Raymond stresses that a child's involvement in Orff-Schulwerk leads to musical skills, awakened imagination, and eagerness to learn in all fields. For all children, this stimulation of mental processes aids in his or her lifelong pursuit of learning.
