

Harrison loses to Canton by a touch

This Farmington-Harrison-Canton swim thing is getting rather frightening.

The two Western Lakes Western Division rivals swam to tie in the girls swim season last fall, forcing a tie for the division title.

On Thursday, the two met again in the boys season and the results were alarmingly as bizarre as in the fall.

Canton, by winning the final event, edged Harrison 89-83. Had Harrison finished first and third in the 400-yard freestyle relay, the meet would have ended in a tie.

"I would have died if we tied again," said Canton coach Hooker Wellman. "I

mean, it was like deja vu."

Harrison was victimized by a strange fate in the 100-yard backstroke. Canton's Dean Roberts won the race with a 1:02.19, no surprise there. But the battle for second changed the whole complexion of the meet.

It appeared that Harrison's Brian Fitzgerald had nipped Canton's Jim Riemschneider for second. But Fitzgerald missed the touch with his hand and the clock didn't stop until his head hit the wall. In the meantime, Riemschneider had touched.

As a result of the misfortune, the Hawks were forced to split their 400 freestyle relay teams in hopes of finish-

ing 1-3. Had Fitzgerald's hand touched, Canton would have had to split its free relay teams. A tie, then, would have likely occurred, according to both coaches.

Harrison's final bid for a tie didn't happen. Canton's Jim Caster, Jim Walker, Kevin Mack and John Ahrens

won the free relay in 3:42.4. Harrison was second, 3:49.5.

The Chiefs (2-2 in the Western Lakes, 3-4 overall) got a double win from Roberts. He took both the 200 individual medley (2:18.56) as well as the backstroke.

Diver Andy Flower also took first for Canton with 239.9.

Canton's only other first came in the 200 medley relay as Roberts, Mickey Adamczak, Steve Schwinn and Frank Wisniewski went 1:55.3.

For Harrison (1-6), Kirk Raddatz won a pair of events. He swam a 1:35.3 in the 200 free and a 52.6 in the 100 free.

Freshman Scott Farabee also won a pair taking the 50 free (24.6) and the 100 butterfly (59.1).

Other Hawk winners were Jeff Bolla in the 500 free (9:18.5) and Tom Sayles in the 100 breaststroke (1:06.1).

NORTH FARMINGTON won its Northwest Suburban League opener

Thursday thumping Redford Thurston, 109-62.

Winners for the Raiders (5-0-1) were Kevin Lee in the 200 freestyle (2:00.93), Dan Manalito in the 50 free (23.92), Bruce Golin in the 100 butterfly (1:03.75), Scott Began in the 500 free (9:35.05), and Angelo Evangelista in the 100 backstroke (1:04.80).

The Raiders' 400 freestyle relay team of Mike Bualti, Craig Burland, Mike Tunney and Brian Golin set a North pool record with a 3:20.80. The old mark set last year was 3:21.0.

North also captured the 200 medley relay (1:45.32).

Soph spikers spark North past RU

Farmington wrestler Dan Parilo picked a fine time to knock a monkey off his back.

The monkey, in this case, was Livonia Bentley's 198-pounder Marty Altonian. Altonian had beaten Parilo four straight times.

But, on Thursday, Parilo got even. He took Altonian on points, 8-7, enabling the Falcons to top Bentley 33-31 in an exciting Western Lakes dual meet.

"That was an excellent match," said Farmington coach Barry Walsh of the Parilo-Altonian bout. "Altonian's beaten him four times. It was a big win for him. They'll see each other again."

Parilo's win was crucial. It gave the Falcons enough points to overcome a void at heavyweight. It also upped Parilo's personal record to 30-4.

Ab Hazen, Farmington's classy 167 wrestler, upped his record to 20-1 with a 54-second pin of Bentley's Dave Zenas.

Other Farmington winners were Mike Stern (90), Dave Hovoy (19-3 at 105), Paul Barringer (132), Darrell

Thornish (138) and Scott Martinuzzi (155).

The Falcons are now 5-5 overall, 4-3 in the Western Lakes. They travel to Plymouth Canton Thursday, Canton, last Thursday, knocked off Plymouth Salem 31-29.

NORTH FARMINGTON lost its first Northwest Suburban League match of the season Thursday to league-leading Westland John Glenn, 45-24.

Glenn captured 8 of the first 9 matches against the Raiders.

James Benda (132) was the lone North winner in the light and middle weights.

S'craft balance beats Macomb

This could be the start of something big. Just listen to Schoolcraft College men's basketball coach Rocky Watkins. Watkins called the Ocelots' 61-51 win over Macomb CC last week "our best game of the season."

"We're a predominantly freshman team, but now we're learning what it takes to win on the college level," said Watkins. "We're doing the things that are necessary to win."

It was Schoolcraft's third straight victory. The Ocelots led 10-12 overall and 3-1 in the Eastern Conference.

Depth is no longer a problem with Ocelots now that two of the team's leading scorers, Harold Hartin and James Orr, have returned. The two were declared academically ineligible three weeks ago, but were recently reinstated after a clarification by the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA).

SCHOOLCRAFT used nine players

against Macomb and all contributed to the win.

Point guard Clarence Jones led Schoolcraft with 13 points and Brad Turner added 12. Livonia Franklin product Dave Carravallin, who was hot early, and Hartin added 9 and 8 respectively.

"With Orr and Martin back it makes the rest of the team work harder," Watkins said. "And another thing that has evolved is Jones as our leader."

"We're starting to develop a personality that I can understand."
