House building classes offered

Michigan Owner Builder Center, provider of information, training and support necessary to create a home at an affordable price, announces three classes: house building, remodeling and owner as contractor, beginning Feb. 4.

The house-building class, taught by Owner Builder Center Director Kenneth Oxley, begins 7-10 p.m. Monday, Feb. 4 and continues every Monday and Wednesday for seven weeks. The cost is

\$350 per person; \$375 per couple. Oxley, a registered architect, licensed builder and real estate broker, will teach the new two-session owner-as-contractor seminar on Saturday, Feb. 23 and Saturday, March 2 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. "We'll teach participants how to manage building a home without lifting a hammer," said Oxley.

"First, we take a comprehensive look at the feasibility and responsibility

of serving as contractor, including pricing and financing the project. Then we cover how to find subcontractors, work with them and check their production; work with building inspectors; obtain permits, write contracts and other formalities," continued Oxley. "About 20 percent of the overall cost of building a home can be saved with the owner as contractor." The cost for the seminar is \$175 per person; \$275 per

couple. All classes will be at the Owner Builder Center, 1505 E. 11 Mile, west of Campbell Road and east of Main, in Royal Oak.

The Michigan Owner Builder Center is an affiliate of the Berkeley, Calif., Owner Builder Center. Both were featured in the fall 1983 edition of Friendly Exchange, the Magazine of the Farmers Insurance Group.

Recalling his early days as a police officer, Wiggins said he chose a career in police work because "it's just the sense of accomplishment you get by helping people who need your help."

"You see people who are less fortunate than you are, and you can do something for them. I'm not sure whether I knew that or not when I started."

Wiggins holds an associate's degree in criminal justice from Henry Ford Community College and is expecting to complete a bachelor's degree from Madonna College in May.

"I plan on attaining a master's degree in either public administration or business administration," Wiggins said.

Wiggins' goal "without knowing what the future holds, is to be promoted within the department."

Coyle, 30, a Lake Orion native, started his police career by taking an educational leave of absence from General Motors to attend the Oakland County Police Academy.

"It couldn't have worked out better."

The day I was hired here I was laid off by GM," said Coyle, who was hired by the Farmington Department three weeks after his graduation from the academy in 1979.

Farmington is the only police department in which Coyle has worked. He

also spent one year in the department's detective bureau.

Although Coyle said he had "a good job" with GM, he was interested in police work because of "the idea of the variation of activities everyday and working with people in all different circumstances."

Coyle holds an associate's degree in criminal justice from Oakland Community College and like Wiggins is completing a bachelor's degree in criminal justice.

"I plan to continue into a master's program when I'm finished," said Wiggins, who lives in Farmington with his wife and 3-year-old son.

Coyle's goals include finishing his education and doing "what I can to contribute to the department."

"I really enjoy Farmington," Coyle said. "This community, the government, is just a well-run organization."
