

Hospital installs medical officers

Installation of St. Mary Hospital's medical staff officers took place Jan. 16 at a dinner sponsored by the hospital, which is at Five Mile and Levan roads in Livonia.

Dr. Shaqat Ali was installed as medical chief-officer. Ali, an internist whose offices are in Northville, has been on the medical staff at St. Mary Hospital since April, 1971.

Ali's degree in medicine is from Nagpur University in India. He has served on the staffs of hospitals in India, Eng-

Hospital plans health classes

Heartsaver CPR will be taught in a three-hour session set 6-9 p.m. Feb. 4 and 11 and March 4 and 11. There is a \$3 fee.

Heartsaver CPR includes signs and signals of heart attack, risk factors for heart disease, healthy heart living and one-person rescue. Successful completion results in certification by the American Heart Association.

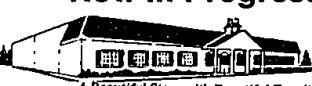

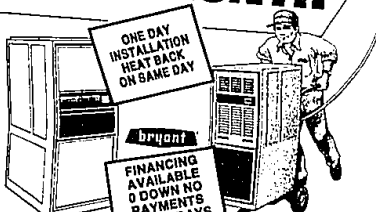

DUST CONTROL - SS-1b ASPHALT EMULSION APPLICATION 1985 DUST CONTROL PROGRAM

Sealed bids will be received by the City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan at the City Clerk's office at 31555 Eleven Mile Road until 10:00 a.m., Eastern Standard Time, Tuesday, February 12, 1985, at which time all proposals will be publicly opened and read aloud in the City of Farmington Hills City Council Chambers. Proposal forms available at the City Clerk's office.

Proposals must be submitted on proposal forms furnished by the City. Each proposal shall be accompanied by a Certified Check or Bid Bond by a recognized surety company in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500), payable to the City of Farmington Hills, as security for acceptance of the contract. All bids shall be submitted in sealed envelopes and clearly labeled Bid - SS-1b Asphalt Emulsion for Dust Control 1985. The successful bidder shall furnish to the City a surety bond in an amount at least equal to 100% of the contract sum (bid price for SS-1b asphalt emulsion, undiluted, multiplied by 8,000 gallons) as security for faithful performance of the contract.

The work consists of furnishing all labor, materials and equipment necessary for the application of asphalt emulsion for dust control; including five (5) or six (6) applications, for approximately three (3) miles of gravel roads. The total estimated quantity of asphalt emulsion needed for the City's 1985 Dust Control Program is 8,000 gallons. The SS-1b asphalt emulsion shall be applied in a diluted solution of one part SS-1b to nine parts water.

Proposals must be submitted on proposal forms furnished by the City. Each proposal shall be accompanied by a Certified Check or Bid Bond by a recognized surety company in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500), payable to the City of Farmington Hills, as security for acceptance of the contract. All bids shall be submitted in sealed envelopes and clearly labeled Bid - Calcium Chloride for Dust Control 1985. The successful bidder shall furnish to the City a surety bond in an amount at least equal to 100% of the contract sum (bid price for 38% calcium chloride multiplied by \$30,000 gallons) as security for faithful performance of the contract.

The work consists of furnishing all labor, materials and equipment necessary for the application of 38% calcium chloride dust control; including four (4) or five (5) applications, for approximately forty-eight (48) miles of gravel roads. The total estimated quantity of calcium chloride needed for the City's 1985 Dust Control Program is 450,000 gallons.
