AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 9, EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM OF TITLE I OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF FARMINGTON

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:

1.221. Retirement System Continued.

The City of Farmington Employees' Retirement System heretofore created pursuant to the provision of Chapter 5, Section 5.1 of the Charter of the City of Farmington is hereby continued. The effective date of said retirement system is January 1, 1952.

1.222. Short Title.
This chapter may be cited as the City of Farmington Retirement Ordinance.
