Czech author talks of his homeland

Czechoslovakian author, Dr. Josef Skvorecky, will talk about the cultural situation in his native country at 2:30 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 23, in room 226 (the American Room) of the Manogian

Building on the Wayne State University campus.

Skvorecky, who is currently a professor of English at the University of Toronto, will be one of three guest

speakers in a symposium on the "Struggle for the Free Development of Culture in East Europe."

Skvorecky, who holds a doctorate degree from the Charles University in Prague, is the author of several books and short stories. He was awarded the Neustadt International Prize for Literature for his fiction in 1960 and was a Guggenheim Fellow. His most recent novel, "The Engineer of Human Souls," was published by Alfred A. Knopf in 1984.

Other speakers will include: Polish journalist Mariusz Ziomecki, who served on the staff of the weekly newspaper, Kultura and the Solidarity Weekly in Poland before joining the Detroit Free Press as an editorial writer; and Wencelas J. Wagner, professor of law at the University of Detroit, a participant in the Warsaw uprising in 1944, author and editor of legal histories.

A brief reception in room 470 of the Manogian Building will follow the symposium which is sponsored by the WSU Polish Studies Program. There is no charge for admission. The public is invited. Further information may be obtained by calling 577-3545.
