Getting in to see the nation's largest defense con-tractors isn't casy for a small supplier. . Today, though, representatives of 1 Michigan firms met in Los Angeles with purchasing semis for nine of the biggest with the help of the Mich-gan Department of Commerce, this week they'll sow their wares to such buyers as Hugbes Aircraft, General Dynamics Corp., TRW, Rockwell Interna-tional and Ford Aerospace. "It's a chance to get noticed," said Dan Woolf, aking part for the third time in a state-sponsored mission. The trips have brought his Wayne-based Woolf Aircraft Froduct 3250,000 in saise of tubular exhaust systems, fuel and oil lines and breather tubes.

"The state gets us in the door. After that, it's how good a salesman you are."

"We have no trouble recruiting as many firms as we can handle. But they recognize it's a gamble."
