

Weekend college helps get her a degree

An eight-hour working day and involvement in several community and professional organizations left Carol Otto with dim hopes of ever earning her college degree. Then the Farmington Hills resident heard a radio ad for Mercy College of Detroit's Weekend College, where classes are held on Saturdays.

"The problem was that after working all day, I was too tired to attend classes," said Otto. "But I wanted very much to gain the knowledge that a college degree would give me."

Otto, marketing and sales manager

for Michigan Bell Communications, achieved her goal in December when she graduated from Mercy College of Detroit's Weekend College with a bachelor of science degree in business administration.

In the Weekend College, classes are held on Saturdays for adults who work and family responsibilities make it difficult to attend evening classes during the week. Six major areas of study are offered in the Weekend College.

OTTO SAYS the flexibility of the Weekend College Program allowed her to continue her involvement with community and professional organizations. She does volunteer work with the Junior League of Birmingham, serves on the board of Youth Living Centers and is involved with the Direct Marketing Association of Detroit.

Weekend College classes typically meet for four hours five times a semester. In between class meetings, students complete independent assignments which enable them to cover the same course content and meet the same academic standards as their counterparts in traditional college programs.

Classes meet during the fall and winter semesters and summer session. WEC students have access to Mercy College's library facilities and media resources. They are able to transfer credit from previous college courses and to obtain academic credit for knowledge learned through professional experience. In addition, they are eligible for financial aid.

The famed duet from "Porgy and Bess" (being performed for the first time by New York's Metropolitan Opera Company) will be sung by Barget and Ebersole. Barget will also join White in singing the "La ci darem" duet from "Don Giovanni." Among the other works will be excerpts from "Die Fledermaus," "Kismet" and "Man of La Mancha."

The final performance in the series will be by Elji Hashimoto, one of the world's foremost harpsichordists and professor at the University of Cincinnati, College-Conservatory of Music, who will perform on April 15.
