The school is staffed by nine teachers, an administrator, a counselor, one psychologist and one placement teacher, according to Farmington Superintendent Lewis Schulman.

THE POLICE report said that at least "40 disorderlies" were involved in the incident, with 10 persons directly involved in the fight.

Approximately 75 students attend classes at Shlawassee. Boys Republic is a state-run facility which houses juveniles who have been ordered detained by the courts. Although run by the state, the Farmington School District is responsible for the youths' education.

While the students are housed at the Boys Republic grounds on Nine Mile, they attend classes at Shiawassee, north of Nine Mile, on Shiawassee.

The fights were the result of an argument which had taken place between the youths at Boys Republic the night before, according to teachers.

"I felt we should have been told about what happened at Boys Republic the night before," said one teacher. Discipline, say teachers, is a prob-lem.

And lodging complaints with the ad-ministration or the teacher bargaining unit seems to get little results, either.

"The (teachers) contract is very general. There is no other situation like this. The language just doesn't apply," said a teacher, who was told to "forget about it" when reporting a threat earlier this year.

One teacher reported that morale was better than last year because an administrator had been called in to aid the building administrator in "structuring" the system at Shiawassee.

And although police were called to the facility, charges weren't pressed. Boys Republic officials told police they would handle discipline over the inci-dent

Celebration of the holiday at Hillel Day School includes explanation of its historical and religious significance, the rabbi said. "And yet, it has all those elements of being a fun day."

"This year, I certainly don't see any pattern of who's what," the rabbi said. The oldest students, the ninth-graders, decided to dress as various cartoon characters.

Thursday, students at the school gathered to hear the story from the Book of Esther, read from a special scroll called a "megiliah."

The students used noisemakers, or "graggers," to make noise each time Haman's name was mentioned.

"We try to make enough noise to stamp it out," Abramson said. Students at the school also had the chance Thursday to have their pictures taken in costume. A "fun house" and a Purim play were also part of the day's activities.

"It's a time for satire," the rabbi said of the play. "I won't be surprised if someone ends up playing me. I consider myself lucky if I don't come out as Haman."
