ROCKY'S MOTHER Rusty (clever nickname for a rednead) is a tough biker lady whose predilection for sex and drugs probably developed because her father, Abe (Richard Dysart), is a nasty old dool, short-tempered, demanding and unforgiving. Her mother, Evelyn (Estelle Getty), is a silly, simpering woman who manages to be annoying just standing around.

Cher, as Rusty, just doesn't pull it off. She's tough, she's drunk, she's zonked, but mostly she's just wooden, as in a drug-inducted stupor. Cher's best moments in the film are with her son and those moments of stenderness are effective because of Stoliz. Cher plays off bin but the scene are his.

The bikers who form Rusty's circle are such cliche characters that they should have been animated cardoons. Sam Effliott as Rusty's current, all-time great love is physically attractive, if you like unshawen bikers, but totally ineffective with his repertoire of one facial expression.
