

# Teachers offered science courses

Junior and senior high school teachers will have an opportunity to enhance their teaching skills in biology, chemistry, physics, mathematics and computers at Madonna College, Livonia.

They may also earn credit work during Madonna's Summer Institute beginning June 21. Courses to be taught are immunology, human genetics, comput-

ers in chemistry education; advanced inorganic chemistry and modern physics; atomic and nuclear.

Other courses are scheduled in evening hours, beginning May 6. These courses include computers, anatomy and physiology, calculus and analytic geometry and enhancing fundamental concepts in biology.

These courses may be applied to the

18 semester-hour requirement for continuing education.

Candidates who hold a certificate and wish to be recommended for an additional endorsement must complete a minimum of 18 semester hours of course work at Madonna. Prior course work and experience will be evaluated for transfer or experiential credit.

Madonna College is the only college

in southeastern Michigan authorized by the Michigan Department of Education to recommend candidates for the new endorsement in computer science.

# Workshop highlight social work issues

The 30th Annual Social Work Forum, sponsored by the WSU School of Social Work Alumni Association, will be in the Student Center Building on Friday, March 29. Theme for the forum is "New Horizons in Social Work."

Keynote speaker for the event will be Dr. Nancy Humphreys, director of the School of Social Work at Michigan State University.

Registration fee for the forum is \$20 for alumni association members, \$25 for non-members, and \$10 for students and senior citizens.

Sixteen workshops covering issues from "Social Workers and Divorce Mediation" to "Professional Burnout" will be throughout the day.

Humphreys, a past president of the National Association of Social Workers (NASW), is currently co-chair of NASW's PACE (Political Action for Candidate Election). As part of her political interests, Humphreys has provided leadership in the national effort to register low income voters. She has also had a long term interest in wom-

en's issues and was appointed by former President Jimmy Carter to serve on the National Advisory Committee on Women's Issues from 1978 to 1980.

She was honored in 1981 as New Jersey's Social Worker of the Year and a year later was selected as a Distinguished Alumna by the University of Southern California Graduate School of Social Work.
