Harbinger Concert coming

Harbinger Dance Company will close its 15th season with performances Friday through Sunday, April 12-14, in Oakland Community College Smith Performing Arts Theatre.

The concert will feature the premier of "The Window," a work by freelance choreographer Dale Andree. The sensitive and emotional duet is choreographed to the music of Cole Porter. The company will also present "Three Figures." Choreographed by Harbinger's artistic director and founder, Lisa Nowak, "Three Figures" will be performed to music by Maurice Ravel.

Composed by three men and six women, Harbinger was formed in 1970. The contemporary dance company whose repertory includes dramatic theatrical works, semi-classical ballet and jazz-oriented and abstract works, has appeared throughout Michigan, as well as Kansas, Minnesota, Ohio and Iowa.

The concert will begin at 8 p.m. Friday and Saturday, following an optional preconcert dinner at 6:30 p.m. On Sunday a special "Champagne Brunch" will be served at 11:30 a.m. The concert immediately follows at 1 p.m.

Tickets for the dinner-theatre combination are \$18 per person, and \$20 per person for the brunch-concert combination. Reservations for dinner or brunch are required at least one week prior to each performance. Tickets for the show are \$7 in advance, or \$8 at the door.

"Up With Science" celebrates spring

A flight from the mundane is in store for those visiting Cranbrook Institute of Science during "Up With Science," a major spring celebration, April 8-14, except April 7, Easter Sunday, at 500 Pine Road. Spirits will soar along with kites, sailplanes, silent gliders, paper airplanes, Frisbees, boomerangs and orbi-hoppers during the 10-day extravaganza introducing the combined scientific and fun principles of flight.

From a lecture exploring the mysteries of unidentified flying objects to games, demonstrations, field trips, shows, planetarium and laser presentations and a major contest, "Up With Science" is the ticket to a bird's-eye view of man's ingenuity.

Featured along with a dazzling display of kites will be demonstrations exploring air pressure, aeronautical designs, how to construct origami figures that fly and carve birds from wood.

In addition to daily planetarium demonstrations entitled "Footsteps" and laser/light concerts "Lasera VII: Pink Floyd" and "Fireworks," there will be a reptile show.
