**YOUTH SOCCER** — Registration is

being accepted for children in grades kindergarten through third for the spring soccer program at the Parks and Recreation office. Games will be played on Saturdays, with teams practicing once a week. A six-game schedule will be played. Registration fee is \$11 per participant. Informational flyers have been dispersed through the schools and may be used for mail-in

registration. Registration deadline is Friday, March 29.

**AFTER SCHOOL RECREATION** — Activity flyers for the spring season have been dispersed through Farmington-area schools. Classes will include gymnastics, rhythmic gymnastics, ballet, Kid's Kitchen, woodworking and more. The sites for our spring season will be Eagle, Flanders and Larkshire Elementary schools, and the six-week program will begin the week of April 1st. Registration for classes are taken on a first-come basis.

**BOATING SAFETY** — In cooperation with the Oakland County Sheriff's Department, an approved and certified course by the Department of Natural Resources will be offered to qualified

youths, 12-16 years of age, to operate a motorboat of six horsepower or more without adult supervision. The class will meet 6-9 p.m. Tuesday, April 16 and 23 at the Farmington Hills Library, 3737 W. 12 Mile. Advance registration and fee of \$3 per participant is required by April 12.

**CPR** — A nine-hour comprehensive CPR class will be 7-10 p.m. April 16, 18 and 23. The class will meet for three sessions at Duncle Middle School. The \$5 registration fee includes CPR books and related materials. This class is offered in cooperation with the Farmington Hills Fire Department.

## LPN's urged to update degree

Licensed practical nurses will be admitted to the bachelor's degree nursing program at Madonna College, Livonia, beginning in May. Twenty LPNs will be enrolled in a pilot project to "professionalize" the practical nurse, a move encouraged by nursing associations and hospitals, according to Sister Rose Marie Kujawa, Madonna's academic dean.

A licensed practical nurse could complete the bachelor's degree in three years, said Sister Rose Marie. They would have completed their nursing programs at such sites as area community colleges, the Shapiro School of Practical Nursing or Detroit Practical Nursing Center. She estimates that there are more than 18,000 LPNs in the seven-county area of southeastern Michigan who could apply for the project.

Licensed practical nurses are invited to an open house in nursing since 1984 and initiated a graduate degree with a specialty in nursing in 1983. Last year, 100 percent of graduating nurses who took the licensing exam passed.

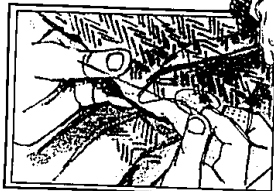
