## Blood pressure control taught in 5-part class

The Oakland County Health Division in cooperation with the American Heart Association will offer a series of five blood pressure control classes to residents of Oakland County. The classes will be held weekly, from 7:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. Tuesdays beginning April 2 in Oakland County Health Division's South office, 27225 Greenfield Road, Southfield. Classes are free but advance registration is required as class size is limited.

Topics that will be covered during these classes include defining the disease (an overview of high blood pressure and its control, film series based in treatment, dietary recommendations (meal planning and food choices), and living with high blood pressure. Classes will be taught by Oakland County Health Division public health nurses and nutritionists. Activities and information sheet will help class participants better understand high blood pressure and self-care skills. Spouses or other family members are encouraged to attend.



The Detroit Institute of Arts is the exclusive Midwestern site of *The Precious Legacy*, a collection of artwork rescued from the Nazis at the end of the war.
