Local UAW Unions Are Also Making Demands

Seven United Auto Workers (UAW) union locals in Observariand are presenting local demands to area plants this week in a little-noticed adjunct to the Big Turee auto industry calks.

The daily working conditions of some 53,000 area workers will be affected by the negotiations of the seven locals with their respective plant officials.

These individual plants could be struck if there's an impasse in the local bargaining, even if the master UAW contract for more than one million workers nationwide receives ratification.

WASH UP TIME, grievance procedures and layoff policy are typical local issues. In contrast to the high-powered position statements, data bargainers' profiles and other materials slickly published by both sides prior to, during and after the master contract bargaining, local demands are couched in near secrecy. Officials of two area UAW locals told Observer Newspapers Thursday. "They're being presented now but, I'm sorry, there's no clearance given to release any information."
