

Meadow Brook Sets New 8-Play Schedule

Terence Kilburn, artistic director of Oakland University's Meadow Brook Theatre has just announced plans for the theater's 1970-71 season.

Kilburn, who became director on the resignation of John Fernald, has chosen a new eight-play schedule for the season.

The local, resident, professional theater will open its fifth season with Thornton Wilder's comic free-for-all of the human race, "The Skin of Our Teeth," Thursday, Nov. 5. The schedule also includes "Life with Father," which still holds the record for Broadway's longest running comedy, opening Thursday, Dec. 3.

Jan. 7 is the date for unveiling a revival of Arthur Miller's "The Crucible." Considered by many as the author's greatest work, "The Crucible" deals with an individual defiance of a repressive society.

MOLIERE'S CLASSIC of

satiric wit, "Tartuffe," will begin its run on Feb. 4.

Works of a more contemporary nature will usher in the spring season with "The Rainmaker," by N. Richard Nash opening on March 4. Set in the Southwest, "The Rainmaker," is a poignant comedy about a charming confidence man who turns life upside down for a lonely, young spinster.

Edward Albee's "Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?" will bow April 1, with the now-famous couple, George and Martha, playing their cruel game of violent communication.

An eccentric Pied Piper leads his happy band of Manhattan non-conformists against the system in Herb Gardner's "A Thousand Clowns," opening April 29.

Meadow Brook will salute the spring season and present its first musical when "The Fantasticks" opens May 27 as

the last offering of the theater season. The whimsical comedy by Harvey Schmidt and Tom Jones has delighted audiences around the world and has been playing continuously off-Broadway since it first opened in May of 1960.

Mailboats Are Commemorated

Marine Band Will Play At State Fair

The scarlet-coated U.S. Marine Drum and Bugle Corps, one of the most famous musical outfits in the nation's armed forces, will appear at the 1970 Michigan State Fair, which runs from Friday, Aug. 28, through Monday, Sept. 7.

Based at historic Marine Barracks in Washington, D.C., the Drum and Bugle Corps has built a repertoire ranging from traditional marches to modern popular selections. It is also known for its precision marching.

The schedule of appearances for the Drum and Bugle Corps is:

- Monday, Aug. 31 - 2 p.m. at the Music Shell, 4 p.m. in the Coliseum, and 6:30 p.m. in front of the Grandstand.
- Tuesday, Sept. 1 - 2 p.m. in front of the Grandstand, 5:30 p.m., in the Coliseum, and 7:30 p.m. in front of the Grandstand.

Director of the Marine organization is Warrant Officer Gary L. Losey, of Denver, a 16-year Marine Corps veteran who has served with the Marine musical units around the world.

In addition to musical proficiency, each member of the 50-man Drum and Bugle Corps must maintain his military skills, remembering that his primary job in the Marines is that of a combat rifleman.

Included in the musical unit are 14 soprano bugles, six French horn bugles, eight baritone bugles, and three contra-bass baritone bugles. This adds variety to the music, giving half-tone changes and slide trombone effects.

The drums include bass, tenor, and snare. Crashing cymbals round out the unit.

The 58th Exhibition for Michigan Artists will be held at the Detroit Institute of Arts from Dec. 16, 1970, through Feb. 7, 1971. This is the biennial juried show of paintings, drawings, graphics, photography and sculpture by State artists.

Entry procedure will require artists to submit one 35 mm color slide in a 2" x 2" cardboard mount of each painting, drawing or graphic and two slide views of each piece of sculpture. Deadline for slides, which must be accompanied by the official entry form, is Saturday, Oct. 17.

PRELIMINARY SCREENING will take place from the slides and accepted artists will be requested to submit the actual work to the museum for final jurying by Saturday, Nov. 14.

A \$3 entry fee, regardless of number of entries, must be paid

by each artist with the slides. Unlike previous Michigan Artists Exhibitions, both the preliminary screening and the final jurying for the 58th Exhibition will be done by the same person, James Elliott, director of the Wadsworth Atheneum, Hartford, Conn.

Since his appointment in 1966, Elliott has supervised a \$4.8 million construction project to expand the Atheneum's facilities and services. He has reorganized the museum's administrative structure, originated a program of graphic design and revitalized a program of the performing arts, with particular emphasis on contemporary concepts of dance, music and other performances.

Of the several Atheneum exhibitions carried out under his direction, the most important have been the "Sculpture of Tony Smith" and the pioneering exhibition of 17th

and 18th century furniture in 1967 to celebrate the 125th anniversary of the Atheneum.

PRIZES AND PURCHASE FUNDS

Expected to total about \$3,500, will be awarded at the prize awards banquet to which all artists represented in the exhibition will be invited. The banquet immediately precedes the exhibition preview on Tuesday, Dec. 15.

A one-man show by Lee Edward Collet will be presented simultaneously with the Michigan Artists Exhibition. Collet received the top award - the Museum Collection Purchase Prize - for his fiberglass, formica and aluminum sculpture "Hatch on Two" during the 57th Exhibition.

Each eligible artist may submit a maximum of two entries. All work must be for sale and must have been completed since Jan. 1969.
