# Injuries can't ground high-flying Hawks

When Lauri Runk was injured, most people across the Western Lakes girls track league said goodbye to Farmington Harrison's title chances. A big mistake.

A bit hurt, but mostly inspired by the lack of faith, the Hawks have posted off four straight victories including league victories against Livonia Bentley and Livonia Churchill last week.

"The kids felt like a lot of people kind of wrote them off when Lauri went down," said Harrison coach Mark Babcock. "The kids felt let down, and they want to prove that they aren't that bad a team. We're not No. 1 or anything, but we're coming on."

The Hawks passed their stiffest test Thursday, beating a good Churchill team 70-58.

A strong effort from the relay teams powered the Hawks' win. Jamie Holcomb anchored both the 800-meter relay (teaming with Jill Blesa, Tracy Smith and Jamie Lyons on a 1:54.88) and the 1,600 relay (teaming with Tracy

Brody, Beth Christie and Lyons on a 4:18.0). Kim Hart, Andrea Pascoe, Jenny Anderson and Brody brought home the 3,200 relay in 10:35.29.

Tracy Salomon was the long jump (14-43). Brody won the 100 high hurdles (16.78). Holcomb won the 300 low hurdles (48.3). Brody won the 400 dash (1:04.5) and Anderson won the 800 (2:32.0).

Against Bentley Tuesday, the Hawks lost but had three events in a 90%-28% rout. Hart, Blesa and Brody won a pair of events each.

Hart won both the shot put (28-1) and the 100-meter dash (13.2). Blesa won the high hurdles (16.6) and the 200 (28.6). Brody won the discus (87-24) and the 400 (1:02.7).

The Hawks will take their 4-0 record into the Farmington City Meet at Farmington High Tuesday.

FARMINGTON LOST a key Western Lakes Division showdown to a vastly improved Plymouth Salem unit Thursday.

The Rocks used their depth to dispose of the Falcons 72-55.

Each team won six events excluding the relay. But the Rocks put the meet away by conquering three of the four relay events.

Amy Johnson won a pair of events for the Rocks, taking the high jump (4-8) and the 110-yard high hurdles (16.83). Other individual winners for Salem were Karen Marcinik in the discus

(89-7), Stacy Stojeba in the 180-yard dash (12.9), Mary Zerny in the 440 (1:54.7) and Denise Durrer in the mile (5:39.9).

For the Falcons, Alyse Fortune won a pair of events, taking both the long jump (15-14) and the 220 dash (28.8). Kris Devine won the shot put for Farmington (31-1). Lori Casarelli the 330-low hurdles (50.5), Anna Quenneville the 880 (2:35.3) and Nicole Jelley the 2 mile (12:52.8).

Salem won the 440 relay (54.1), the 800 relay (1:55.3) and the mile relay (4:27.1). Farmington captured the 2 mile relay (10:29.9).

The Rocks are 2-0, the Falcons 2-2.

## Depth, good health keep Marlins winning

Mercey took all four relays. The 400 in 56.1, the 800 in 1:56.2, the 1,600 in 4:38.2 and the 3,200 in 11:22.3.

Mercey is 1-0 in the Catholic League and 2-1 overall. The Marlins travel to Harper Woods Regina this afternoon.

### Child's play for adults

- Keep your camera ready. If children are accustomed to seeing you with a camera, they'll act more naturally.




