They are all former waltresses, so what better name for an all-female rock 'n' roll group than Bonnie and the Working Girls?

"I knew it was unusual. We've really made a name for ourselve." AS A result, most of the group's tunes have a feminine perspective, but there's nothing dsinty about the way it knocks out a song like "My Boyfriend's Back" or "Leader of the Pack"

Pack." The Working Girls, decked out in caps and sunglasses, convert the Shangrila's tune of the 1950s into a rock 'n' roll four de force — complete with Williams handling the motorcy-cle sounds. What other all-female band would do 'Leader of the Pack' or, for that matter, 'Geer' 'Gee,' a minor hit of the early 1950s by the Crows, is in the Working Girls' repertoire and may be one of the songs recorded when the band gets around to doing a record.

"A LOT of people have been asking us to do a record. In addition to "Gee," the group would like to do a

song that's a real "kicker," Williams said.

The other Working Girls ware Carline McShane of Gibraitar, lead guitar, Kaylyan Coleman of Garden City, lead singer, Pam Day of Westland, saxophone; Kris Herkness of Garden City, drums; end Keily Reid of Garden City, keyboards.

Bonnie and the Working Girls will be at Charles Too, Ford Road and Merriman Road, Indefinitely from 9:30 p.m. to 2 a.m. every Wednesday—Saturday, For more Information, call 421-6540.
