PHYSICAL EXAMS
FOR ATHLETES SET

Physical examinations for all athletes (male and female) in the Farmington Public School District will be administered by staff physicians from Bostonford and Providence hospitals Thursday, May 30 at North Farmington High School.

Middle school athletes (1985-1986) have their exams between 5:30-7 p.m. High school athletes will go between 7-9 p.m.

All-stater Goins takes act to State

The all-stater is going to State.

Brian Goins, a two-time state champion swimmer and the state record holder in the 100-yard butterfly, will attend Michigan State University next fall on a swim scholarship.

"My brother Kirk is up there, and that will be a big help for me," said the North Farmington senior. "Plus, I know the coach real well and they offered me the most money. So, it worked out well."

Michigan State has offered Goins a 63 percent ride, which is a sizeable scholarship for incoming freshman swimmers.

"That (the scholarship offer) says a lot about how we feel about Brian," said MSU swim coach Dick Fetters. "We don't give out many full rides in swimming."

FETTERS' SWIM teams have been struggling in recent years. Last year, the Spartans finished eighth in the Big 10.

"We've been rather mediocre,"

Fetters said. "But last year we took a giant step, and now with Brian Goins and several other freshmen we have coming in, we're hoping to take another giant step next year. Our goal will be to place within the top five in the Big 10."

Fetters became aware of Goins two years ago when Goins won the state butterfly title as a junior. Then Kirk Goins transferred to Fetters' program after a brief stint at Virginia Tech.

"Kirk is a butterflyer, just like Brian. He came in last year and did a fine job for us. He told me about his brother, and I saw him again in the state meet this year," Fetters said.

Brian Goins set a state record the day Fetters saw him, swimming a 50.79 in the fly. That same time, however, would have rated Brian a 16th place at the Big 10 meet.

"Oh, he still has a lot of work to do," Fetters said. "Our Scott Butler won the Big 10 butterfly last year. He went 49.87. But, I'm counting on Brian to help out significantly next year."

GOINS IS aware of what awaits him.

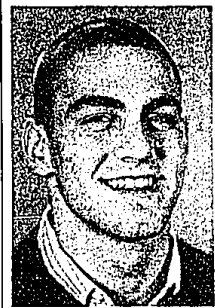
"I hope to really improve in the college atmosphere," he said. "I expect to work harder than I've ever worked before, and I expect to take some big drops in my times. Hopefully, I can qualify for the NCAA meet next year and then place in the NCAA's my sophomore year."

Fetters said he plans to use Goins both in the fly and freestyle events next year.

Goins, coached by Pat Duthie at North Farmington, was a much sought-after college prospect. He considered offers from Tennessee, South Carolina and Nebraska.

"I kind of felt all along that he'd go to State if they gave him the right offer," Duthie said. "His brother is there, it's close to home, and he was pleased with the coach. I think he's happy with his decision."

Said Goins: "I'm real happy with it. My brother is there, and he'll really help me, especially with the studying. And, really, I'm going to school to learn. Swimming comes next."
