Fetters became aware of Goins two years ago when Goins won the state butterfly title as a junior. Then Kirk Goins transfered to Fetters programatter a brief slint at Virginia Tech.

Kirk is a butterflyer, just like Brian. He came in last year and did a fine job for us. He told me about his brother, and I saw him again in the state meet this year, Fetters said.

"Oh, be still has a lot of work to do," Fetters said. "Our Scott Butter won the Big 10 butterfly last year. He went 49.27. But, I'm counting on Brian to help out significantly next year."




