state would provide in aid as it does to in-formula districts.
Consequently, the two districts agreed that the Clarenceville district would function as the financial manager of the grant so the Farmington district would be eligible for funding as part of the consortium.
"The state said there will be money for school districts for gifted education," Dombrowski said. "But only for in-formula through. That was going to mean they (Farmington) wouldn't be eligible."
What's good about the grant, Lewis said, is that the state "doesn't try to tell you what to do with it."

both districts to join forces and work together to provide teachers with knowledge and resources for working with the gifted child in their classroom.
"We (Farmington district) have not gone into a heavy pulling kids out of the regular classroom and separating them," Lewis said, about the district's gifted students.
The district's philosophy is geared toward strengthening curriculum that will benefit the entire spectrum of students, including the gifted.
Because Clarenceville is still developing its gifted program which is targeted to be in operation next year for grades three through six, the consortium has been a welcome boon.
"We could share the expertise of Farmington and plan things together," Dombrowski said.

There is no admission charge. It is open to the public and will be held in Kresge Hall on the Madonna campus.
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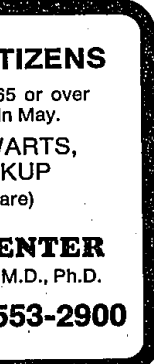
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
