Blanchard unveils new waste plan

Gov. James J. Blanchard announced a plan to work cooperatively with business to protect the public from hazardous wastes.

The stratey relies on sharply reducing reliance on landfills, strengthening enforcement of environmental laws and working with the nearly 15,000 Michigan businesses that are being brought under federal regulations for the first time.

The governor spoke at the 15th annual meeting of the East Michigan Environmental Action Council (EMEAC) at the Cranbrook Institute of Science in Illoomfiled Hills.

Blanchard was honored by the group, which was instrumental in passage of the state's original hazardous waste law, for "outstanding environmental protection and preservation in Michigan."

"DESPITE THE passage of our Hazardous Waste Act in 1978, public conditione in the safety of bazardous waste management in Michigan is still lacking," the governor said.




