Blanchard said the proposal would make the system more cost competi-city and equitable for injured workers. Aides said exact cost savings are im-possible to calculate.

And alluding to GM's forthcoming decision on a site for its Saturn project, he said, "We are trying to do every-thing we can to improve cooperation because that could affect future busi-ness decisions."

ST. ANTOINE said he was delighted with the proposals to address administrative problems. He said they constitute "the one universally acknowledged failure of the system — the crushing backlog of cases (five years)."


